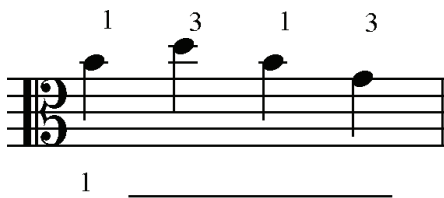


# Dancing Spiders!!

Use this spider dance to help your fingers learn a new way to move across strings.

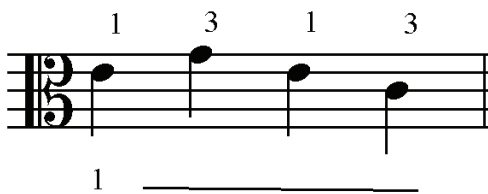
1. Set your 1st finger on the A string and play that note. (named B)
2. Keep 1st finger on the A string and set your 3rd finger on A (don't use your 2nd finger), then play that note. (named D)
3. Keep 1st finger on A and release your 3rd finger. Play the B again.
4. Keep 1st finger on A and walk your 3rd finger (still no 2nd finger) to the D string. Rock your bow to the D string and play that note. (named G)
5. Rock your bow back to the A string. Your 1st finger should still be there! Play the B again to start the cycle all over.
6. Repeat lots and lots of times!

Here's how that looks in musical notation:



See the line under the music? That reminds you to keep your 1st finger down.

Now try the same thing on your G & D strings:



You can also do it on your C & G strings!
